


What is a Hybrid Event?

Benefits of a hybrid event

Typical virtual events have a few characteristic shortcomings

Typical Virtual Events	Our Hybrid Events
Lack of clarity on purpose and objectives	Adhere to meeting 'essentials': set clear aims/objectives, agenda pre-circulated, and meeting ground rules agreed
Participants feel less obligation to attend	Setting activities and exercises require participant input and collective outputs
Participants tend to multi-task or tune out	Use of a 'One Room' approach, using video technology, gives an inclusive feel
Air-time gets dominated by certain individuals	Facilitator-led and roles appointed to ensure all participate and contribute
Meetings happen as standalone events	Pre-reads, outlining next steps and shared post- meeting material

FACILITATION

Facilitators manage the event, centrally and locally, leading the interventions simultaneously

Participants network and collaborate pre-, during and post-event through online activities and virtual breakout rooms



CROWDSOURCING

Problem-solving, idea generation, or information trending to bring the best insights and ideas to the fore



Hybrid Events critical success factors



Seeing each other's faces means reading facial expressions and body language



Capture real-time input: taking input from participants, via a voting/polling tool



Stick to meeting basics: clear objectives, pre-reads, agenda, and clearly outline next steps



Have some fun: some light relief, an icebreaker or the like, helps bolster relationships



Increase interaction and dialogue, steering clear of lengthy presentations



Use a Facilitator: an outsider chairing a meeting can bring a feeling of difference and effectiveness
